A Place for Healing


The goal of healing is God.

There are many reasons people feel happy, but only one of those reasons— God—leads to ultimate happiness. Every other happiness must find it's source in this happiness.

It was Augustine of Hippo who said toward God "He loves you too little, who loves anything together with you, which he loves not for your sake." Or to put it another way, happiness in any blessing (including healing) which does not direct us back to the blessing of God himself is a shallow and transitory happiness.

We want CrossPoint to be a place for healing, but not as an end in itself. Rather, may the end of healing be joy in God and a passion to spread that joy to the ends of the earth.


This AGM marks our first AGM after a full year of existence. I am deeply thankful to God for how he is using CrossPoint Church in my life and in the lives of others.

Looking back

The past twelve months have seen some significant new blessings. One of the significant events has been our sponsoring the Community Craft Night every first and third Wednesday of the month here at CrossPoint. Melissa has done a great job leading these events which have been a wonderful opportunity to connect with a number of people in the community. We need to be praying that God will use some of these relationships to draw people to himself.

Another important programme that we launched in the last year is our periodic prayer events. Kezia has been developing these events which have provided some wonderful times for speaking with God together as an assembly. Doing so is a crucial part of the life of the church and I look forward to more of these events in the future.

Financially, God has provided amazingly! God has opened the hearts of our



people to give with a generosity that is simply remarkable. We were, as an assembly, almost entirely self-supporting this financial year! Thank God for many who reached out to help in the first months of the ministry here, but it is a huge blessing that we're now paying our own bills almost entirely. This is a crucial step for a new church and I'm thankful to see it happening so soon.

As far as the pulpit is concerned, this has been a good year. We began the year finishing up a series through John 3: Jesus and His Nighttime Encounter. We also spent a few months looking at *The Greatest Story: Jesus in the Old Testament.* Over the change of the year we spent a few weeks looking at *I Love Your Word (Meditations on Psalm 119).* Finally, at the beginning of 2017 we started our present series titled *The Gospel of God, Paul's letter to the Romans.* On top of these, we finished working through 1 Peter 1 with John Piper and began a new study through 1 Peter 2-3. We've been able to study Scripture from the broader Old Testament to the Psalms to the Gospels to the letters of Peter and Paul. I look forward to continuing on through Romans this year as we seek to grasp the crucial, foundational doctrines of the gospel there.

Finally, this last financial year has seen the installation of our window sign on the worship centre. This has increased our presence and visibility in the local community significantly. The year also saw the filming of an episode of 60 Minutes in our worship centre. May God use the publicity this gives to open opportunities to minister to our community in new ways.


Looking forward


There are a number of things that we addressed at last year's AGM which have not yet taken shape. I am actively working toward proposing a



doctrinal statement for adoption by our assembly. Additionally, I hope to put a constitution together which will give us some structure and ease the process into our eventual incorporation as an association. Something else this plays into closely is our ability to become more broadly associated with other churches of like faith. I am already personally associated with Thinking of God, an Australian organisation of like minded believers. But as a church, we will at some point face matters such as the ability to have our elders authorised as marriage celebrants. Additionally, while we are self-governing by conviction, this does not mean that we want to be a loose cannon. Membership in some sort of fellowship of like minded believers and churches would provide both support and accountability for us as an assembly. This would likely make believers more willing to connect with us as it would dispel some of the negative implications that can be connected to independence.

A number of people have encouraged me to look into the Fellowship of Evangelical Churches of Australia (FECA). We are not eligible for full membership with FECA at this stage, but I would like us to be praying and





thinking about preparing ourselves to pursue connection with FECA or some similar organisation. Of course nothing will go forward ultimately without it being brought to the church first.

Another big thing on the horizon is the possibility of holding an evangelistic event in connection with AOC Ministries. This would be a wonderful opportunity to bring in believers who are gifted in ways we are not to help reach out in ways we can't. Please be in prayer about how you can be involved in helping with something of this nature.

Finally, please be in prayer for me as I continue to develop a programme called *Finding Your Place at CrossPoint*. This will be a study/course/event (we'll see!) designed to help our guests get connected to the assembly here. It will take each person from where he is and help him to understand where to go from here to become a child of God, to become grounded in the faith, and to be using his gifts to spread joy in God. God willing, once this material is complete, we'll go through it together as a church so we can all develop a clear vision of our goals for every single person that God brings through our doors.



Melissa again donated a number of items to sell, and also Kezia and I collected many free items from the 19 Facebook groups in our area offering such, as well as garage sales and the Buy Back Shop.

De-cluttering our homes, inviting others, letterboxing, donating money and praying are all actions we can take that will increase the funds for our church to use to reach people.

Music

Our music ministry has been a work in progress, but it is finally at the point of running fairly smoothly. We now have three regular musicians and have worked out many of the kinks of rostering and music preparation that we were facing last year. Rosters go out every quarter and we have been slowly adding to our song repertoire to include more theologically sound hymns and choruses for our worship. We have also hashed out a system to make communication between musicians simpler and cause less divergence of the sheet music from the projection slides. This includes a coding system and database that categorises where song sheet music can be found, what key to play in for congregation singing, what function the song best serves as, slide order, etc. Hopefully this will not only cut down on preparation time for current musicians, but will make the music programme flexible and user-friendly when there are changes in musicians or music leadership.

In the next year, we are praying that God might bring along new musicians who would like to get involved in this ministry. We are also praying weekly that the music choices will fit their purpose of worship and not hinder or deflect from the preaching of God's word.

Website

Our church website is up and running and functional. Throughout this last year, we have been working out bugs and working to find new ways to reach the community and keep the website up to date and active. We've added ministry pages for our Junior Church and Mission and a page for the Community Craft Night. We've also seen some encouraging activity throughout our online presence. Our church website is seen on Google up to 70 times a month, and another 20 to 40 people see our centre on Google Maps in that time. Over the past 6 months, 9 people have requested directions to the centre.

Last, we have been working to improve the quality of our sermon audio files on the website so that those who visit our website or who are partnering with us in prayer can listen to our sermons each week. We have purchased a new audio recorder and are tweaking the audio output for better downloads. Hopefully we will have the improved audio files online soon.

We are praying that God continues to use our online resources to reach our community throughout this new year.

Domestic Violence

I am part of a group of women volunteers from different churches across Cairns that volunteer to maintain a "safe room" for the aggrieved during domestic violence court every Thursday morning from 8:30am to 12:30pm. This helps avoid a victim being forced to sit in the same area as her abuser while they wait their turn before the judge.

Setting up and covering the windows before they arrive, we offer the women coffee, tea, and biscuits and provide magazines, as well as toys for the many small children that come with them. We have large photos of what the courtroom looks like plus educational pamphlets, and we provide a listening ear and tissues.

Women police officers are posted nearby and Qld DV and Legal Aid workers meet with each woman individually. We accompany them to the restroom, guard the door, care for children while their mother is in the



courtroom, and see them safely off. Occasionally, I have opportunity to share with them about *my* Refuge and Shield.

This ministry also includes the twenty-four articles on marital abuse posted at www.teaminfocus.com.au and, recently, TV's "60 Minutes" has done an investigative report on my story, extremist pastors, and domestic violence, due to be released in June.

Future goals are to pray for the oppressed living right here among us, to seek out more volunteers, to be open to helping victims, even through our Cairns Community Craft Night, and to donate to safe houses for displaced women and children in our city.

Letterboxing

In the past year, we have letterboxed almost the entirety of Woree and Bayview Heights as well as sections of White Rock and Mt. Sheridan. Many of these areas have received our main church flyer as well as advertisements for our Junior Church and the Community Craft Night. In the next year, we are praying that we can get flyers out to White Rock and Mt. Sheridan as well as finish up the final couple of streets of Woree.
