


Elder's Report

Looking back

God has brought several new people to CrossPoint this year. It's been wonderful to see them settling in. It has also been wonderful to see the warm, friendly way in which new guests are welcomed at CrossPoint! This brings me joy as I see the assembly reaching out with open hearts to those God brings through our doors. May we continue to grow in being a safe, welcoming assembly where new people can feel heard, loved, accepted, and encouraged.

One of the beautiful things for me to see this year has been the way we've been able to steadily increase our giving to and through our care fund. Even as COVID-19 set in, we've seen steady giving to the care fund and been able to give more to help the struggling and poor than ever before! May we continue to demonstrate the genuineness of our faith in our loving generosity for the poor and struggling, especially those who are our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world.

Our times in the word this year have been good. We began the year by finishing up our series in Philippians called *Love*, *Paul*. In September we did a five-part series *Innocence Condemned: The Arrest and Trial of Jesus* from the gospels. Then in October we did an eight-part series through Job titled *When the Storm Comes*. We saw that God is absolutely sovereign in all things, that when the storm hits we must worship, and the profound place of lament in the Christian life. Then we looked at some questions Job wrestled with as he sought to understand the storm he faced. Finally, we saw the lesson Job learned through his most destructive storm: That when the storm has passed, though we may not understand, we always must trust and walk in awe of our great God.

Over Christmas, we turned to Colossians 1:16-20 in our brief series *Condescension: God Came Down*. This year, we have been working through



Galatians in our series *To Those Who Believe*. It has been a rich study so far and I'm looking forward to continuing to work through this letter from Paul to a church in danger of giving up the one gospel that gets us to God. Finally, how could we forget that period of time in which we were unable to assemble due to the global COVID-19 pandemic? During these weeks, we may have stopped gathering as a church, but we didn't stop *being* the church. We missed eight Sunday's together when I shared my heart with you in eight videos looking at texts in 1 Samuel, Job, Psalms, Ecclesiastes, Hosea, Galatians, and 1 Peter.

Before moving on, I want to take a moment to thank each one of you who have invested your lives serving others here at CrossPoint this year. It has not been an easy year in some ways, but so many of you have served God from the heart by ministering to me and us this year. Thank you! May God be glorified in our joyful service for him.

Looking forward

The pandemic is not over. We face the possibility of new restrictions in the months ahead. If God, in his wisdom, chooses to allow this, we will





cooperate as much as we can with the governing authorities. We will bear up under the burden with God's help. And we will find creative ways to live out the powerful, transformative good news that Jesus has died to rescue us and reconcile us to God! We will pray for each other, love each other, and serve each other as best we can in whatever circumstances God allows so that God will be honoured in our assembly.

Please pray with me as I make decisions about how best to minister to you from the word of God. Pray with me that God would continue to build up his assembly here at CrossPoint. Pray with me about how we can best love and build up each person God has placed in our assembly.

And pray with me that God would work powerfully in our assembly and our community this year. I do not want us to be content with hearing accurate sermons. I want us to experience the gracious working of God in our hearts, shaping us and changing us into the image of our saviour, Jesus Christ.

May God grant us a hunger and thirst for himself this year. May we find such joy in him that we want him more.


Statement




Analysis Annual general giving

Domestic & family violence

Even though my family's domestic violence story was aired on Nine Now's 60 Minutes back in July 2017, new Christian abuse victims in Australia and overseas are still contacting Jason and I! This has resulted in hours of crisis counselling, mainly on Jason's part, plus others in our church have provided lodging, transportation, and funds.

CrossPoint has a separate domestic violence fund to assist in aiding victims where needed (see our website for details). We have had generous donations from multiple sources, and the newest, simplest source is exchanging 10 cent cans/bottles for cash. We've collected \$132 this way to date. If you are happy to participate, there is a big plastic bin in the back room of the worship centre or I can pick them up at your home.

Volunteering in the Aggrieved Room at the Cairns Courthouse is on hold due to COVID-19, but should pick up soon. This is a service of mercy during the weekly Thursday morning DV court from 8:30am to 12:00pm. The Aggrieved Room is a closed-off safe room that enables a victim to be hidden from her abuser while she waits her turn before the judge. We offer these grieving, scared women a hot beverage and biscuits and provide magazines, educational pamphlets, tissues, toys for children, and a listening sympathetic ear. Qld DV organisation workers, Legal Aid solicitors and female police officers attend to each woman individually. This is a combined effort of churches in Cairns and volunteers serve on the roster once every 4-6 weeks. New volunteers are encouraged. Sitting with these victims will open your eyes and heart to a whole new world.

Each person is urged, even if you think you understand the unique dynamics of DV, to spend some time reading about and learning about domestic violence.

Future goals for this ministry are to pray for the alarming numbers of oppressed living right on your street, to seek out more volunteers, to be open to helping victims, and to donate to the over-crowded safe houses for oppressed women and children in our own city.

This year we have been saving toward a larger or more ongoing project so we haven't disbursed much. The only project we have supported this year is the ministry of Christian Religious Instruction in our local schools. This ministry is funded through the *Combined Christian Churches RI* which is run through the *Cairns Christian Ministers Network*. We plan to slowly increase our funding of this ministry as we grow until we are making a contribution proportionate to our share of the overall costs of the programme. This is a vital ministry through which thousands of local young people are introduced to the Christian faith each year by a friendly, qualified *Christian instructor using a credible curriculum*. Please pray for the many who will be influenced by local Religious Instruction this year.

It has been good to see increased giving to the mission fund this year. We are now in a strong position to commit small amounts to longer term, ongoing projects as they come up. Please pray that we will find good opportunities to invest this money in the proclamation of the gospel this year.

Website

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, CrossPoint was unable to meet together as we normally would during the months of March through to May. Because of this, Jason delivered short talks and sermons online via our Facebook page and CrossPoint website in order to connect us as a church family and encourage us in our own private times of worship. While this online endeavour came with its fair share of technical glitches and headaches to overcome, God was good and these videos were able to be released on time each week and were viewed regularly not only by our church family but by others around Australia and in other parts of the world. We rejoiced to hear quite a bit of positive feedback about how God used these videos to encourage, build up, and challenge both our church family and other Christians and non-believers during the pandemic lockdown. Since our return to gatherings in person, we have gone back to audio sermons online (these are available on our church website under resources) and we continue to receive feedback from people in various locations outside of Cairns who still listen to the sermons each week. This has been encouraging as we often do not necessarily know how much of the online content we put out is being accessed.

In the year ahead, we hope to continue to find ways to keep our church website up to date as well as look for new ways to improve the functionality and design of the site. One particular challenge we hope to fix is making our audio sermons available for free download so that people do not have to stream them. Please be in prayer for our IT and website ministry about how God might continue to use the technological advances of today for His glory in the year ahead.

Morning tea

Letterboxing

Like many things, the restrictions for COVID-19 disallowed us to undertake one of our letterboxing outreaches this year, but an earlier one late last year and another just recently were able to go ahead. We had good turn up for both with volunteers covering a good portion of Mount Sheridan and Bentley Park with our current flyers. We received some feedback about this last letterboxing drop and were able to make some connections within the community because of it.

In the year ahead, we are hoping to do some more letterboxing drops and look



forward to seeing how God uses this outreach method to build his church. We are always encouraged to see a spike in people searching for and accessing our online material immediately after we distribute flyers and wait eagerly with faith to see some of these seeds planted come to fruition in the year ahead.

Cleaning

On the foyer table, a "How can I help?" sheet is periodically made available for those interested in getting involved in the ministry of cleaning our worship centre. Once the roster is firmed up, it can be accessed on our website. We want people to feel free to work as often or as little as they want. If someone signs up for only one week during the whole year, that is appreciated. Men and women are both able to participate and all supplies are provided.

We aim to clean every three weeks and have split the roster into cleaning the inside and cleaning the outside of the centre. Outside cleaning involves the windows, sweeping the walk and steps, and pouring boiling water on the weeds along the curb. This takes roughly one half hour.

Inside cleaning involves the cleaning inside of the front windows, cleaning the toilet, sweeping, and dusting and can take one to one and a half hours for one person. A list of instructions is posted inside the Trinity Room.

Our aim is to make our worship centre inviting to show others that God matters to us and that they are welcome.
