seen

To live transparently means to live such that others can see who I really am. I don't have to try to sell my strengths or hide my weaknesses. I have looked behind the curtain. I'm willing to see who I am. And I'm willing to be seen.

One of the results of transparency is that I learn to admit it when I do wrong. The biblical word for this is confession. Confession opens a door into myself, not so others can see in, but so I can see out. When I live transparently, I am building trust with those around me. Because they know I am honest with myself. And therefore capable of honesty with them.

But transparency doesn't mean that nothing is kept back. In order for transparency to be healthful, it must be accompanied by firm boundaries. Transparency relates to who I *am*, not everything I think, believe, or do. Healthy transparency involves a willing choice to be truly seeable, along with a healthy sense of what belongs to whom. Confession of wrongs belongs to those who have been wronged. And at some level, emotional honesty belongs to those who have shown themselves safe and trustworthy.

Still, transparency always involves risk. Risk of judgement, rejection, exploitation. We take these risks willingly because our safety is not rooted, ultimately, in our relationships with people, but in our relationship with God. God's unshakeable love for us in the cross makes us willing to take the risk of loving others by truly being who we are before them. though not seeing him now, you believe in him, and you rejoice with inexpressible and glorious joy.

elder's report

looking back

This year has been another year of expansion at CrossPoint. Our joy in God has been expanding. It has been expanding *in* us. And it has been expanding *around* us.

For me, one of the highlights of this last year was our first baptism event. It was wonderful to baptise Tim Corin and Tony Corin after their public declaration of faith in Jesus! We were blessed to have believers from a number of nearby assemblies join us to celebrate. Please continue to pray for these two young men as they continue to grow in grace and in the knowledge of God.

God has opened up a number of opportunities this year for building up believers in their knowledge, skill, and faith in God. A number of us have had opportunities to meet one-on-one with others for these purposes. Whether it is helping others *understand* God and his word better, or helping others develop and use their *gifts* for the good of the body, or whether it is the spiritual ministry of seeking to build up the *faith* of others and pass on something of the joy we have in him, this is what Paul calls "the work of ministry."

One opportunity for learning more about who God is and what his word teaches is the *Introduction to Systematic Theology* course we've been going through this year. This has been a breathlessly swift overview of the major doctrines of the Christian church using R.C. Sproul's *Everyone's a Theologian* as the text.

We've also had some great times in Scripture this year. We began the year by finishing up a brief series in 1 John 4 titled *Loved*. We then began a new series on Acts titled *Expansion: The Story of the Early Church*. This has been quite an in-depth look at book two of Luke's recounting of the




life and work of Jesus the Messiah. Douglas Corin completed his series *Drawn to Christ* looking at Jesus the Christ as he is seen in the psalms of ascent (Psalms 120-134). Douglas then began a new series in Ephesians titled *Come bless the Lord: Living as the workmanship of God.*

A few more things stick out looking back on this year. This is the year we committed to the long-term, ongoing financial support of our first missionary. It has also been a year of blessing for the Lolham family as they welcomed the birth of Matamihiawa and Tamamoko! Finally, it has been a year of difficulty for many in our assembly as God has allowed loss and sadness as a result of health challenges and other events. It is a blessing to be part of an assembly that reaches out and supports each other in times of celebration and in times of sadness.

looking forward

One of the challenges God has put in front of us this coming year is to address the need for more space in our worship centre. As our assembly continues to grow, the need for more space is becoming a vital issue. Place is not the point of Christian ministry. But place still matters because place facilitates ministry. Because of this, I am asking each of our people this year to think about what we can do to build up a \$10,000 down payment in our building fund. Perhaps there are fund raising ideas

you have. Or perhaps you can set aside some money each week to contribute toward this goal. Whatever God might lead you to do, please join us in asking God to provide for this need.

Another crucial matter, looking forward, is the need for our assembly to be grounded in prayer. Without the vine, the branches can do nothing. All of our spiritual strength and vitality comes from God himself. And we are desperately in need of his Holy Spirit to do the things that only he can do. All the preaching and savings and effort in the world will amount to nothing substantial if God does not do a supernatural work in us and in others through our proclamation of the good news that we are rescued from God's wrath through the death and resurrection of Jesus at the cross. He has made substitutionary satisfaction and we are alive! It is a miracle that only God can do. So we need to be asking him to do it.

This relates especially to the ministry of the word. Our preachers depend on God's answers to your prayer every time we prepare to preach. Please continue to help us in this way. It will be to your own benefit and ours.

Finally, thank you to each person who has used your time, energy, money, and gifts for the good of the body at CrossPoint this year. Your labour is not in vain.

This has been a huge year for mission at CrossPoint. In December 2021, we began an ongoing commitment to support the evangelistic work of Andrew Walkington through OAC Ministries. Andrew and his team focus on speaking the gospel directly to unbelievers in a systematic way. They also train others to do this. We committed this year to investing \$100 per month to help in this work. This partnership has been God's answer to our requests over several years that he would direct us to the right opportunities.

It has been wonderful to see our Mission account balance remain fairly steady in spite of this significant new commitment. This reflects new giving and the heart our assembly has for the explicit proclamation of the gospel.

We keep a fairly large buffer in our Mission account to ensure our ability to meet our giving commitments over the long term. We will need to increase our giving this year if we are to maintain the commitments we have in the long term. Please pray about what you can do to see the gospel go out through these strategic partnerships.

- Long-term benefit with a preference for capital investment."

This committee will make recommendations directly to the elder/s. The goal is to form a plan that will support the ministry work we do while making the most efficient use of the financial resources entrusted to us.

This year I will be asking our assembly to pray about how we can prepare for the future by setting a goal of getting our building fund up to \$10,000. This is a scary goal and will call for broad effort and sacrifice, but it is an important step toward putting together a down-payment for purchasing our own worship centre. It is not clear yet how soon we can afford to buy, but it is our goal to be prepared when the opportunity arises. Please pray about how you can contribute to this goal.

domestic & family violence

CrossPoint has a heart for the oppressed and vulnerable, so we have a fund for victims of family and domestic violence. The past has seen several victims helped financially. Our main source of current help is through hours of free counselling and follow-up.

Donations can be given online or by bringing in your metal and glass cans and bottles so we can get the cash from recycling them. There is a large plastic bin with a purple lid in the back room for this purpose. Our goal is to accumulate a \$2,000 buffer in this account.

This year we tried to get back into volunteering at the safe room at the Courthouse on Thursdays when the court hears DV cases, but that opportunity has been suspended, firstly because of the pandemic and now the court has gone to holding hearings via Zoom. We also tried to get in as volunteers at Ruth's Hub at Raintrees Shopping Centre, but they were in the process of closing down in that location.

The biggest way you can help is to pray for all the women and children suffering, especially due to the pandemic when families were trapped indoors with their abusers and also the loss of jobs making bad financial situations. I encourage each person to educate yourself on the unique dynamics of domestic violence by googling it online. Anything we can do to spot and fight this evil in our neighborhoods is God-honouring. There are also several books we can recommend.

IJMA has been doing some amazing work throughout the pandemic bringing oppressors to justice, freeing slaves, advocating for the oppressed, and assisting victims of human trafficking and other forms of oppression. We are blessed to have had a small part in making this possible.

In addition, we've been able to maintain our giving in three additional categories this year: Assisting persecuted believers through Open Doors Australia, supporting the medical work of Rachael Cochrane in Vanuatu, and assisting with the practical needs of others through World Vision Australia.

Every dollar that is given to our Care account goes directly to supporting such beneficiaries. Our goal is to keep our working balance in this fund around \$200.
