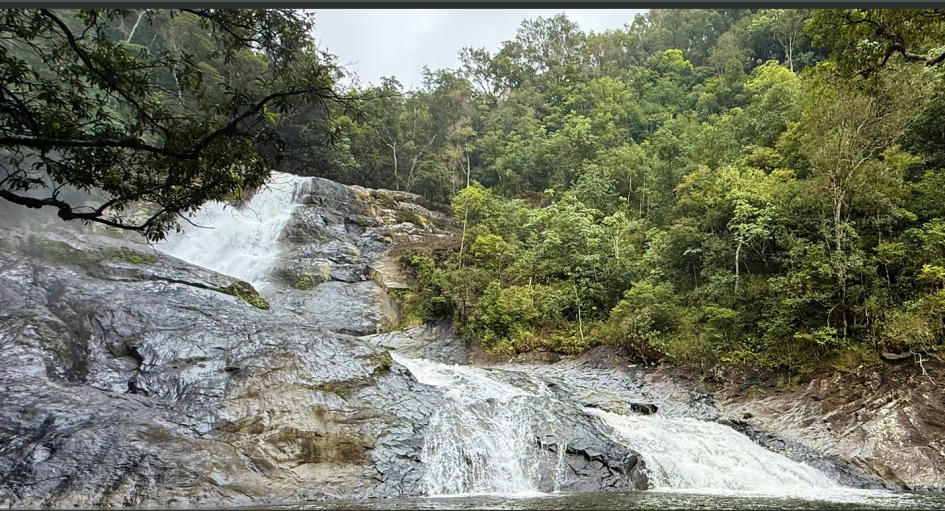

what makes us glad?

We have expressed our mission at CrossPoint as spreading joy in God. We understand this statement to encompass all the classic aspects of the purpose of the church such as proclaiming the gospel of Jesus, calling unbelievers to repentance and faith in him, teaching the Scriptures, uniting together in the habits of fellowship, bringing believers to maturity in Christ, and coming together for regular worship of our God.

But it is possible to misunderstand what we mean by joy in God. When we speak of joy *in God*, we do not mean that we are to have joy while we are in God, where “in God” functions like “in Christ” functions in the Apostle Paul’s theology. We do not mean that we are to have joy while being a Christian. Such a concept is entirely contrary to what we mean.

Rather, when we speak of joy *in God*, we speak of the *cause* of our joy. In other words, this is not about joy while being Christian as if it were enough to have joy in our spouse or in our hobby while being Christian. It is, rather, about joy which springs from our experience of who God himself is. It is a happiness which comes specifically from remembering and thinking about what our God is like. And from spending time in personal relationship with him through prayer and meditation on his revelation of himself in Scripture.

If our joy is merely joy from some other cause while being Christian, it is a coincidence which at best points us back to the God who gave it and at worst is an idol. Because it points, not to God, but to some lesser cause of some lesser joy. It is only joy *in God* which remains stable, even in the darkest moments of grief, because it is caused by a beauty which is ultimate and infinite.

I will go to God.

Our tenth year as an assembly was eventful. In October 2025, we had a great camping trip on the weekend of our tenth anniversary. The site

On Reformation Sunday, we looked at an overview of church history and looked at a quick outline of the many reformers God used during the Reformation era. In December, our Carols @ the Hospital was a wonderful opportunity to reach out to those in the new wards at Mental Health. If you haven't taken part in this event before, please consider making it a part of your Christmas tradition. It is always such a blessing to me.

We spent much of our time together in Scripture this year in our series on Jeremiah. I have come to value and appreciate the book of Jeremiah so much through this series and have been challenged to grow in my theology as I seek to understand his ministry. Douglas finished his series through Ephesians titled *Come Bless the Lord: Living as the Workmanship of God*. This thirty-six part series was a wonderful look at the rich theology and practical instruction of one of Paul's most profound letters. During the Christmas season, we saw that the story of Scripture itself, from Genesis on, was always about Jesus in our series *Journey to Bethlehem*. Finally, Tim has continued leading us through the comforting theology of 1 Peter 1 in his series *Hope for Exiles*.

We've also had a few "Let's Study the Bible!" sessions this year including two "Let's Study the Bible: Wisdom Edition" sessions. These have been great opportunities to practice the skills of reading and understanding the Bible together.

Another milestone this year has been reaching our goal of raising \$10,000 toward our building fund. This is a huge accomplishment for us and it is worth celebrating. Many people have given sacrificially for many years to achieve this goal and it is an important step toward acquiring a more



stable and sustainable presence in our community. Please pray that God will open doors as we proceed to explore our options in the coming year.

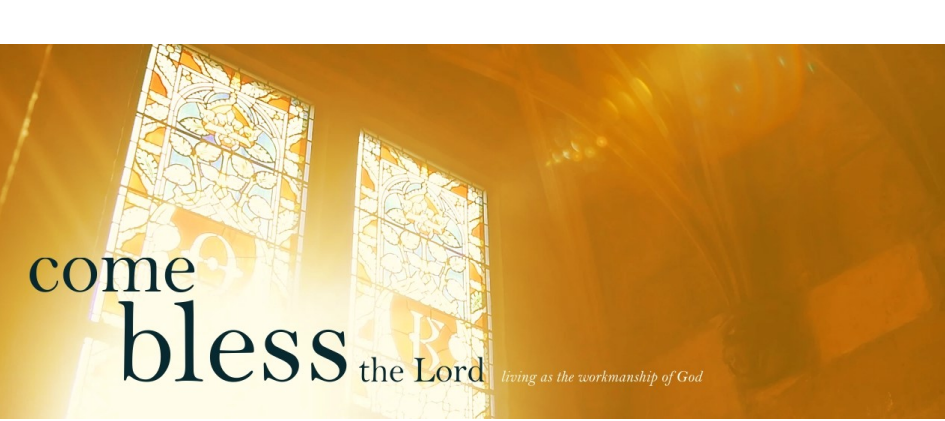

And we maintain *teachability* by spending much time carefully expositing Scripture so that even our understanding of the creeds will be Scripture-shaped. And Scripture itself will remain our rule of faith and life.

Please pray with me that God will help us to humbly and graciously live out our faith in a cross-shaped love for each other here at CrossPoint. And that this cross-shaped love would not merely settle here for us and ours, but would expand out into our community, our country, and the wide world beyond our shores. May we be about our master's mission, spreading joy in God as proclaim the gospel of Jesus crucified.

Wow! It has been amazing to see how our assembly has come together to accomplish so much toward our goal this year! Giving to the building fund increased by 112% this year. And we’ve smashed our goal of raising \$10,000 in the building fund! Thank you for coming together to invest in God’s work at CrossPoint in this way. May he use our offering for his glory in spreading joy in himself to many in Cairns, across Australia, and around the world.

Many challenges lie ahead. We do not know what stands between us and our goal of a worship centre of our own. But we have some momentum now and are making progress in the right direction. Please keep giving if you can. And please keep praying that God will open doors.

Our next step is getting ourselves incorporated. This is not essential, but would simplify the process. And continuing to build up our building fund balance. This increases our borrowing capacity somewhat, but mostly it increases our initial equity in the building which diminishes our risk and the risk our financier needs to take. Perhaps we should set a new goal to work toward? Is \$50,000 realistic? It feels audacious. Very. But then so did \$10,000 four years ago. And here we are. Perhaps some audacity in pursuit of the progress of God’s kingdom in Cairns is ok. Please consider whether you might join with us in pursuing this audacious goal.

CrossPoint had a part in helping free more than 12,000 people from slavery in 2025 through our support of International Justice Mission Australia. It is such a blessing to be able to take part in such an important work as an assembly. This is what the gospel causes people to pursue. The cross transforms us until we want to serve people in soul *and* body even at great personal cost—cross-cost.

Our care fund is currently distributed in three categories: assisting persecuted believers, fighting human trafficking, and providing medical and practical support to those in need. Every dollar given to our care fund goes to supporting these and similar humanitarian causes.

Our goal is to keep our working balance in this fund around \$200. This allows a buffer for meeting any needs that come up suddenly. Please see our website for more details on how these funds are distributed. Please pray about how you can participate in this work.

domestic & family violence

Our members have contributed \$264 to our domestic violence fund through our Containers for Change programme this year. There is a large plastic bin with a purple lid in the back room at the worship centre to receive recyclable containers. If you want to contribute directly to this fund, the banking information is on our website.

We have received another lot of phones from DV Safe Phones, the national organisation that collects used phones, wipes the data making them untraceable, then sends them to distributors across the country like hospitals, domestic violence organisations, law-enforcement agencies, and safe houses. CrossPoint is the provider for the Cairns area and offers a free Samsung or Apple mobile phone, new SIM card, and charger to each victim trying to stay safe.

This year we have had many opportunities to help survivors of domestic abuse both in the Cairns community and across Australia and the world. This has involved everything from providing practical help like food or a lift to helping connect people to services and providing counselling over the phone, through video chat, and in person. To protect privacy, we don't talk about this often, but this work is going on in the background on a weekly basis and your prayer and support are vital.
